MIRAI NIHONGO GAKUIN CHILDREN'S COURSE 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR

PROGRAM SUMMARY

- Japanese as a foreign language program (Absolute beginner to intermediate level)
- This year we will offer 4 levels of group lessons: K-3rd, 4-7th, Teens 1, and Teens 2.
- For pronouncing Japanese, we will use Romaji (a system of Romanized spelling used to transliterate Japanese). Therefore, it is desirable for students to have the skills to understand and read the English alphabets.
- Up to 8 students per class.
- It is first come first served, but priority will be given to current students for a certain period.
- Students must cooperate with the class activities and follow the classroom rules and teacher's directions well.
- Students are required to complete age-appropriate homework each week to increase their exposure to Japanese. Parents do not need to have any Japanese language skills or knowledge; they simply need to encourage their students to complete the homework.
- Once a month, students will have cultural activities. They can get familiar with Japanese traditional celebration and customs of the season.

CLASS LEVELS AND SCHEDULES

K-3RD STUDENTS

Students will learn basic vocabulary and simple sentences and aim to get used to Japanese language and aim to build a foundation though fun and hands-on activities, such as singing songs, crafts, and games. For writing and reading, they will aim to recognize all hiragana by the end of school year.

- Saturdays 9:00 am 10:30 am (90 minutes)
- Fully in-person sessions at the PJCI campus
- Textbooks: The instructor will provide handouts as needed.
- Material Fee of \$10 is required per student, per year.
- Students are required to practice listening, speaking, or writing Japanese for 10-15 minutes every week, as homework at home.

> 4 - 7TH STUDENTS

Students will learn all 4 skills (speaking, listening, reading, and writing). For reading and writing Japanese characters, they will learn all hiragana in the $1^{\rm st}$ semester, and all katakana in the $2^{\rm nd}$ semester.

- Saturdays 10:45 am 12:15 pm (90 minutes)
- Fully in-person sessions at the PICI campus
- Main Textbook: Japanese for Young People 1 (Student Book) by AJALT
 - Students will study L1 to L7 in this school year and do so L8 to L15 next year.
 - The class will cover Vocabulary, Key sentences, Exercises, and Quiz mainly. Main Dialogues and Short Dialogues may be skipped as needed.
- Material Fee of \$10 is required per student, per year.

- Students are required to purchase their own textbooks. Workbooks are not required to purchase.
- Students are required to practice listening, speaking, or writing Japanese for 15-20 minutes every week, as homework at home.

➤ TEENS 1 (BEGINNER-LEVEL OF TEENS, OR HIGHER LEVEL OF 4-7TH STUDENTS)

Students will learn all 4 skills (speaking, listening, reading, and writing). For reading and writing Japanese characters, they will learn all hiragana in the $1^{\rm st}$ semester, and all katakana in the $2^{\rm nd}$ semester.

- 8/17/2024 to 5/31/2025 (37 days, 55.5 hours in total)
- Saturdays 9:00 am 10:30 am (90 minutes)
- Fully in-person sessions at the PJCI campus
- Main Textbook: Japanese for Young People 1 (Student Book) by AJALT
 - ➤ Students will study L1 to L7 in this school year and do so L8 to L15 next year.
 - The class will cover all the content of the textbook.
- Students are required to purchase their own textbooks. Workbooks are not required to purchase.
- Material Fee of \$10 is required per student, per year.
- Students are required to practice listening, speaking, or writing Japanese for 20 25 minutes every week, as homework at home.

➤ TEENS 2 (HIGHER LEVEL OF TEENS)

Students need to recognize most of hiragana and katakana characters when they are enrolled. They will learn all 4 skills (speaking, listening, reading, and writing) plus grammar, too. Aim to build a strong foundation sitting for the level of challenging the AP Japanese exam in high school within 2-3 years. For reading and writing, they will learn 36 new kanji.

- Saturdays 10:45 am 12:15 pm (90 minutes)
- fully in-person sessions at the PJCI campus
- Main Textbook: Adventures in Japanese 3rd edition, Vol.1 by Cheng and Tsui
 - This year the class will cover L7-L12 in 2024-25 school year.
- Materials (Copies of textbook and workbook) will be provided, and therefore
 NO purchasing them is required.
- Material Fee of \$10 is required per student, per year.
- Students are required to practice reading and writing Japanese for 10-15 minutes every week, as homework at home.
